

## **NFN Website Report 2022 (for Jan 2023 AGM)**

As before, the website continues to serve its purpose well in so far as it provides a basic reference point for all our news, forthcoming events and archives of articles, newsletters and other materials created over the last 10 years. A website working-group was established in 2022 and much effort was put into discussing the website and conducting research and surveys of NFN members views. I have no detailed information about this since September 2022 but perhaps the working group will produce their own report on any developments. At January 2023 we have (according to Wordpress) 272 persons 'following' the website (2022 - 247).

In 2022 we had (according to Wordpress) 5336 visitors to the site (2021 - 5959, 2020 - 4597), with 15422 page views including 8830 from the UK (2021 - 8803) and 3942 from the USA (2021 - 2840). (According to our flagcounter.com page counter, we have had 4732 GB visitors and 3382 US visitors since October 2020 with a total of 9736 from 75 countries (2021 - 6099, 61 countries)).
